



Revegetation Activities

NatureWest has a large suite of revegetation and plant conservation programs in the western region of Melbourne. Our 2020 program will see 23,000 new indigenous plants in the ground, placed along waterways and in remnant patches of valuable habitat. As well, we are undertaking weed removal of several feral weed species such as Tiger Pear, Boneseed, African Thistle and African Lovegrass in publically owned land.



Working Bees are focused on areas where we can make a difference like waterways. Some plantings are in high-value remnant habitat, and are aimed at maintaining the habitat into the future. Volunteers are briefed on safety, and well equipped to carry out the task. At the end of the formal activities, groups normally meet for a social chat and BBQ sizzle.
